ENGLISH GRAMMAR THE SENTENCE

We express our thoughts by speaking or writing words which are arranged in a particular order. These groups of orderly arranged words make complete sense and convey a clear meaning.

A Sentence is a group of words which are arranged in a particular order to convey a complete sense and a clear meaning,

Remember

<u>A sentence always begins with a capital letter.</u>

The words used in a sentence must be in a definite order.

Punctuation marks, e.i. full stop(.) , question mark (?) or exclamation mark (!) must be used at the end of a sentence.

EXAMPLE

These mangoes are almost ripe. _Full stop

Take care of your health.Full stop

Whose umbrella is this? Question mark

How well she dances ! Exclamation mark

KINDS OF SENTENCES

Assertive Sentences : An Assertive sentence expresses

a statement to a fact.

A statement always ends with a full stop (.)

Example: There was a diary on the desk'

The girl drank a glass of juice .

Interrogative Sentences : An Interrogative sentence asks a question.

A question always ends with an interrogation mark (?)

Example: Which book are you reading?

Where are these people going ?

Imperative Sentences : An Imperative sentence expresses an order or a request.

An Imperative sentence always ends with a full stop (.)

Example : Do not talk so loudly.

Try to do better.

Exclamatory Sentences : An Exclamatory sentence exoresses a strong feeling.

An Exclamatory sentence always ends with an exclamation mark (!)

Example: How intelligent this student is !

What a delicious meal !
